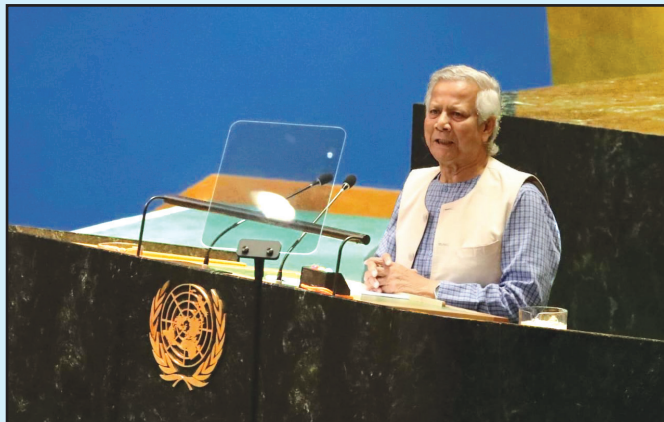

BANGLADESH IN UN PEACEKEEPING

Bangladesh is committed to upholding the principles outlined in the United Nations Charter, promoting the peaceful resolution of international conflicts and maintaining global peace and security. Bangladesh is a peace-loving country. This very fact is enshrined in the constitution of Bangladesh with the foreign policy dictum "Friendship to all, malice to none". Bangladesh on its quest to establish world peace has already made enormous contribution under the auspices of Blue Helmet. Steadfastly inherent to this policy, Bangladesh Armed Forces and Bangladesh Police have globally been engaged in the United Nations Peacekeeping Operations (UNPKO) for the last 37 years. To commemorate their glorious participation, every year on 29 May observed the International Day of United Nations Peacekeepers. This year's main theme is "The Future of Peacekeeping."

Bangladesh embarked on its participation in UN peacekeeping missions in 1988 by initially sending 15 military observers from its army to the Iran-Iraq Military Observer Group (UNIIMOG). This was followed by the deployment of Bangladeshi police personnel to Namibia in 1989. Later, in 1993, the Bangladesh Navy joined peacekeeping efforts in Mozambique, while the Bangladesh Air Force began its involvement in Bosnia-Herzegovina the same year, marking the nation's expanding role in global peace operations. From Haiti to East Timor, Lebanon to Congo the peacekeepers of Bangladesh have left their footprints in almost every place crawling in conflict. They carry out their duties amidst the shivering cold of Bosnia, the scorching heat of the Sahara Desert and the dull humid weather of East Asia. Leaving behind all differences of religion, creed and cast, Bangladeshi peacekeepers risk their life in serving global humanity. Today, they have earned the time-honored credentials of a 'Role Model in global peacekeeping by dint of proven professionalism, impartiality, integrity and humane attitude in their approach.

With all-out support from the Government of the People's Republic of Bangladesh, the country now stands as one of the world's foremost contributors of military and police personnel to global peacekeeping efforts. To date, a total of 2,00,558 Bangladeshi peacekeepers have served in 63 UN missions/operations across 43 countries/regions. Currently, 5,818 Bangladeshi peacekeepers are actively engaged in 10 ongoing missions/assignments worldwide. Besides, the participation of women peacekeepers for global peace is gradually increasing. Meanwhile, 3,645 women peacekeepers have successfully completed their mission and currently 444 women peacekeepers are working in various peacekeeping operations. Till today, 168 Bangladeshi brave and valiant peacekeepers have laid down their lives and 272 peacekeepers suffered major injuries for the greater cause of world peace. In observing the International Day of United Nations Peacekeepers-2025, let us pay our deep respect and homage to the supreme sacrifice made by these true sons. Their sacrifice has brightened the country's image in the world. Bangladesh resolutely reiterates her firm commitment to always undertake any UN assignment for global peace and stability.
